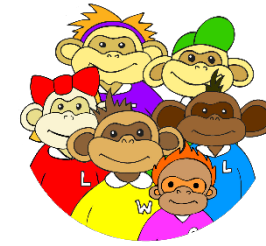

- increasing all staff's confidence, knowledge and skills in teaching PE and sport
- increasing engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity and sport
- raising the profile of PE and sport across the school, to support whole school improvement
- offer a broader and more equal experience of a range of sports and physical activities to all pupils
- increase participation in competitive sport

Warren Park is a two-form entry primary school with a strong sporting tradition. Having received a number of School Games Awards over the years, Warren Park aims to continue this tradition and further increase participation, mastery and teacher development.
